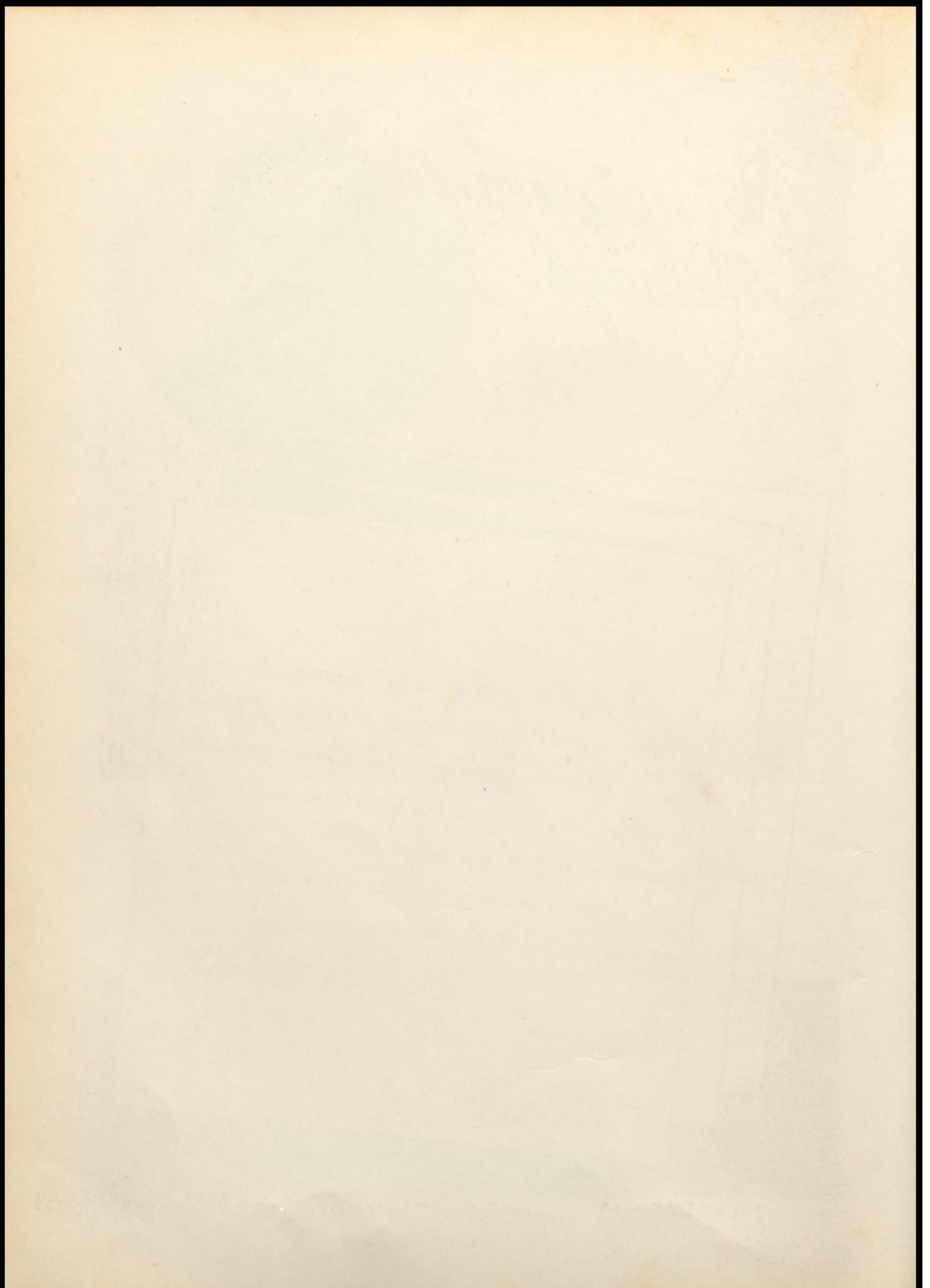


The Class of 1950 is to be commended for its efforts in reviving the Bunnell High School Annual.

I, Barbara Botsford, leave my year-long headache to next years' Annual Editor.

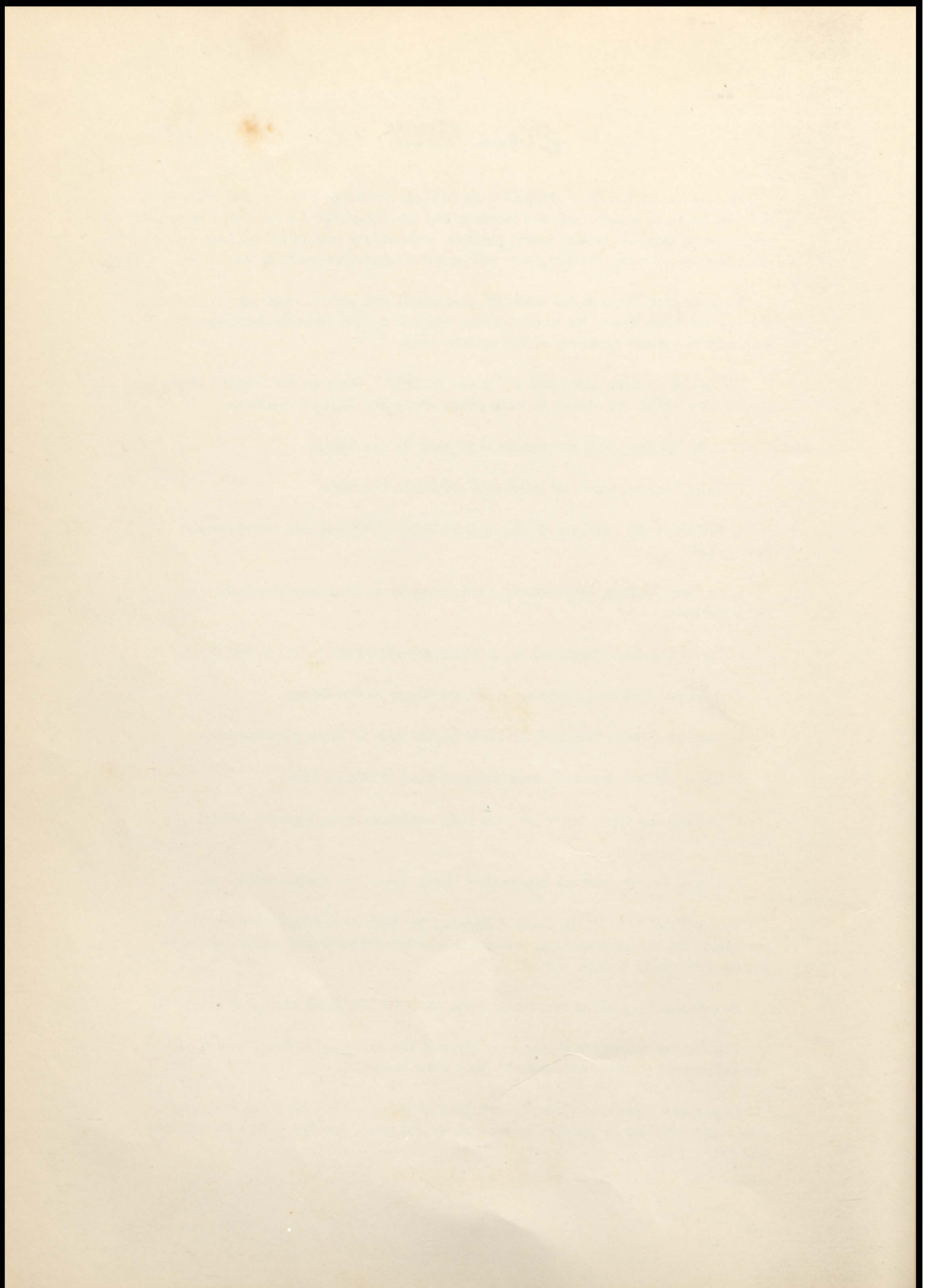
I, Jimmy Teters, will my expression "hello lover" to Junior Strickland.

Wilburn Kelly I see coaching football for Michigan State University. He plays as hard as the boys when they have a game.

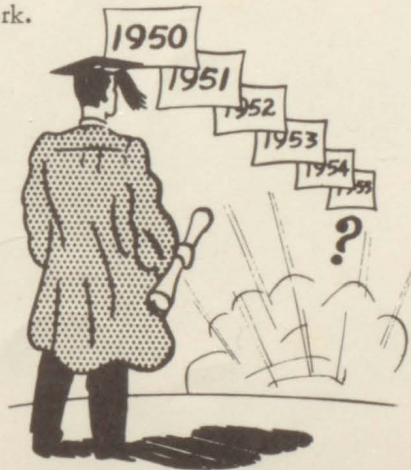
Jimmy Teters I see doing dare-devil stunts for Barnum and Bailey Circus. After straightening the road at Mound Grove, he found there was no other life for him.

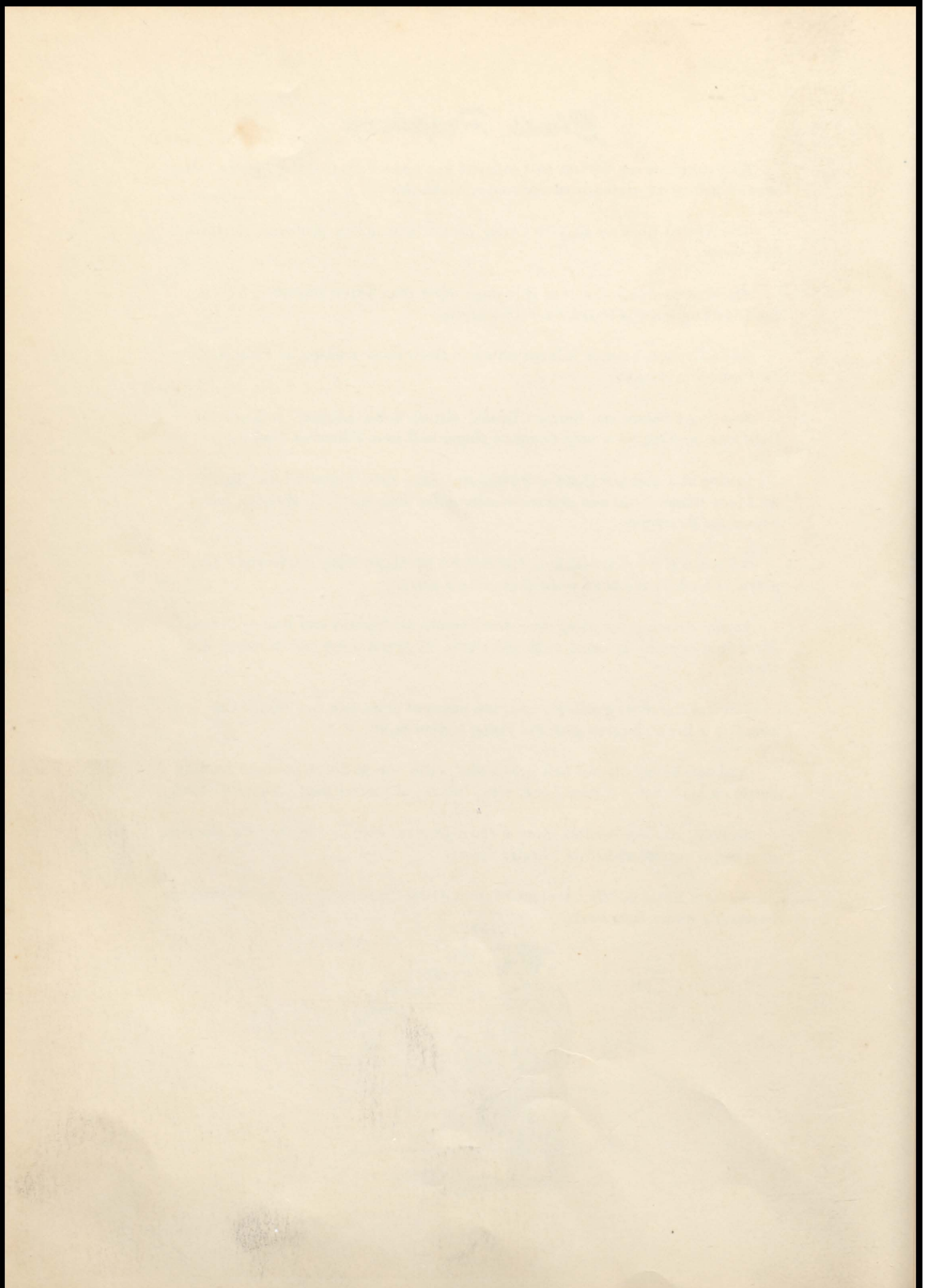
General Herschel Pellicer, after ten years of Army life has decided to retire to a life of leisure with his young Italian bride.

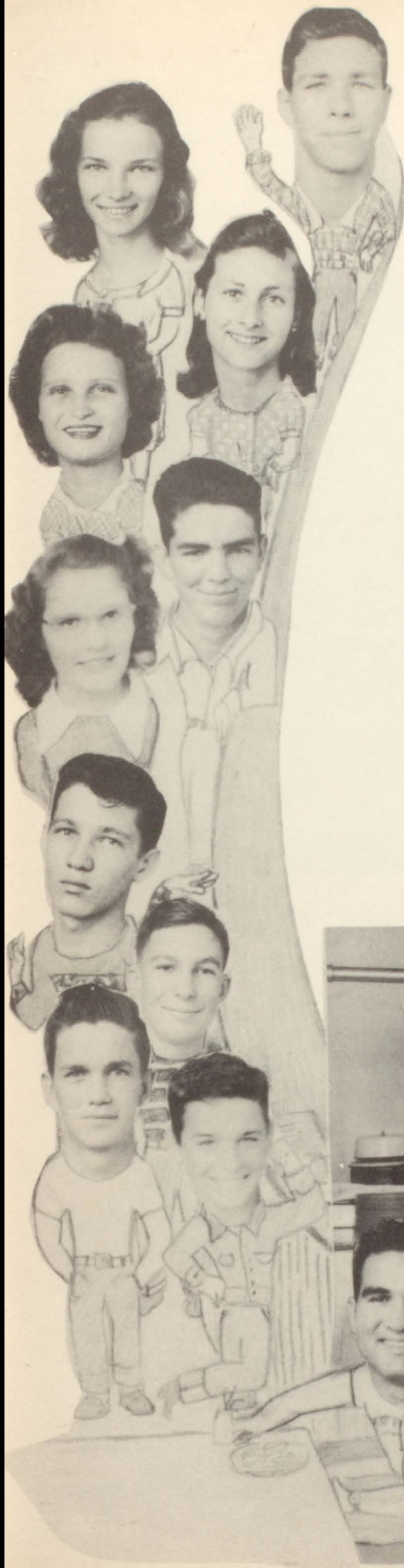
And now as my crystal ball grows dim, I can see in the mist a man herding cattle on his ranch out Haw Creek way. He is none other than Charles Cowart.

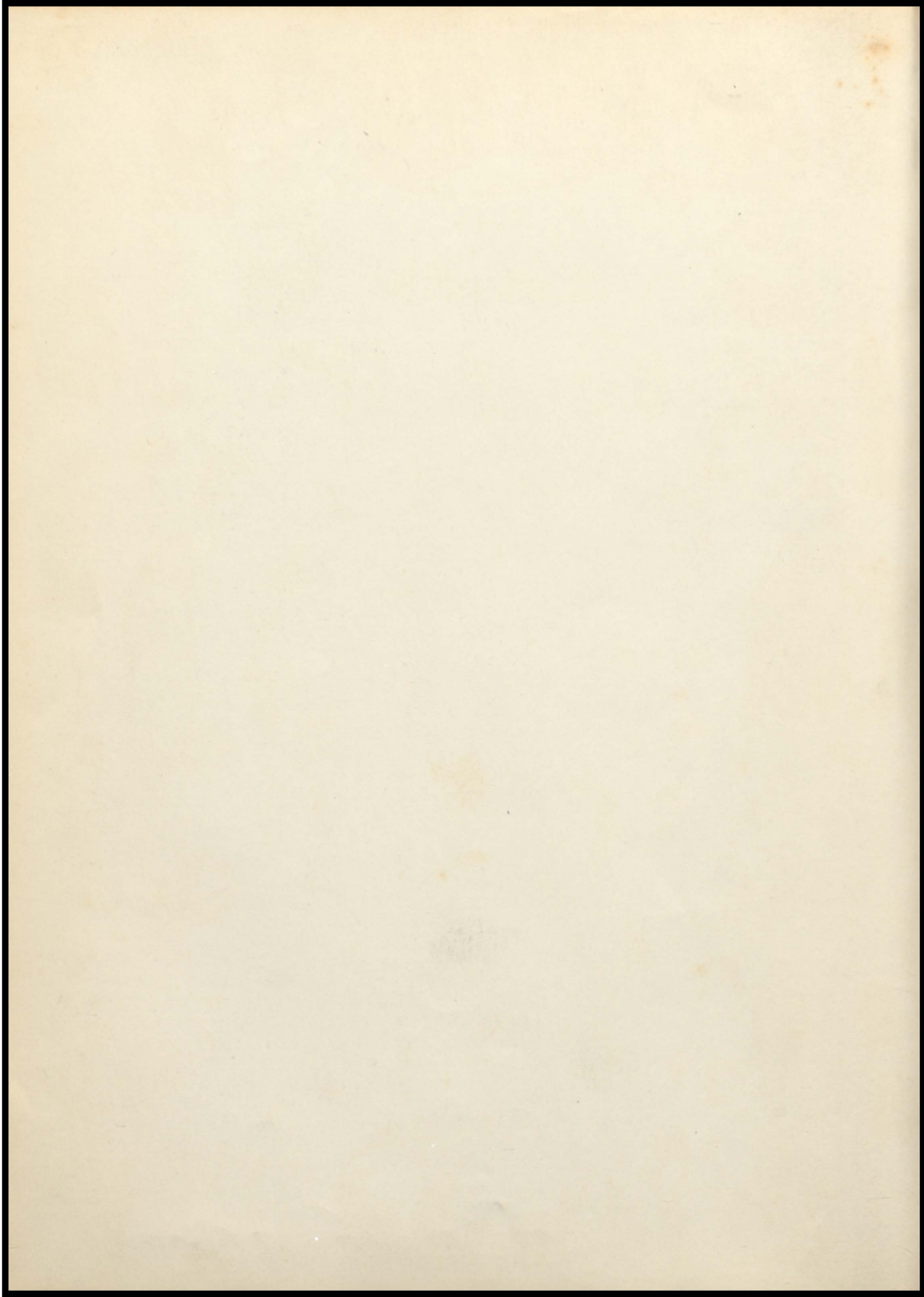
The above picture shows both Bands of the High School and Grade School they have both gone a long way from their humble beginnings today each is receiving their due.
