SENIOR CLASS POEM


Our high school days are near the end, The storms of life draw nigh, But these twelve years have only been, A twinkle in God's eye.

We look with humble gratitude, To those who reared us well, And stooped to raise us up again, As aften as we fell.


But when that final day arrives, And we are laid to rest, We can say, "Dear earth, I served thee well, Dear God, I did my best."


