In our next school year we learned the meaning


of the word "Sophomore." We were both wise and foolish. We put on our share of dances and bake sales, trying to earn money for our prom and banquet.


BETA CLUB







BOAT TRIP TO NASSAU TAKEN BY BAND

BAND TRIP TO NASSAU, JUNE 1960

After a great many money-making projects, and careful planning, the Band left at 6:05 a.m., on Friday, June 10, in two school buses for Miami. The Seniors and Juniors were privileged by having a bus for ourselves. About ten miles south of Bunnell our bus broke down. After much confusion and fussing we lowered our esteem and rode with the younger members of the Band. Imagine, the whole Band, plus chaperones and luggage, all packed into one tiny school bus rambling to Miami. We looked and felt like sardines in a can.

Well, we finally arrived in Miami at 2:00 p.m. After unloading and getting our keys to our rooms we boarded the S. S. Bahama Star and after some difficulty, found our rooms, and incidentally near the engine room.

Immediately after the boat embarked, we all went to our rooms and dressed for dinner which was at 6:00 p. m. The boys wore coats and ties and the girls, pretty dresses. It was a rule for everyone to "dress" for dinner.

By midnight just about everything that was consumed at dinner was now in the ocean. Golly were we SEASICK!

The next morning the sea was still rough but not as bad as during the night. Following breakfast we lined the rails of the deck to watch the activities at the dock in Nassau. Groups of native boys climbed up the anchor ropes and entertained us by dancing, singing, and jumping and diving from the top deck of the boat. We showed our appreciation by tossing money into the waters of the Nassau harbor.

Finally we were permitted to leave the boat and go into Nassau. The instant we hit solid ground we were very happy—the ones who were still seasick got well immediately.

We went to the Straw Market where everyone bought a hat and then bargained with the natives for other straw goods. Most of the stores were closed for the Queen's birthday, but most of us busied ourselves with the rental of motor bikes and cars. This was exciting, especially driving on the left side of the road.

We toured the island, which is 21 miles long and 7 miles wide. Some of the sights that attracted us were the Straw Markets, Post Office, Warer Tower, Old Fort, Sea Gardens, and Paradise Beach.

At night, we restricted our activities to the boat. A recreation director planned entertainment for the passengers – dancing, floor shows, games, etc. until the early hours of the morning.


When we left Nassau the band played and the native boys entertained us once more. The sea was smooth, so no one got sick on the way back.
